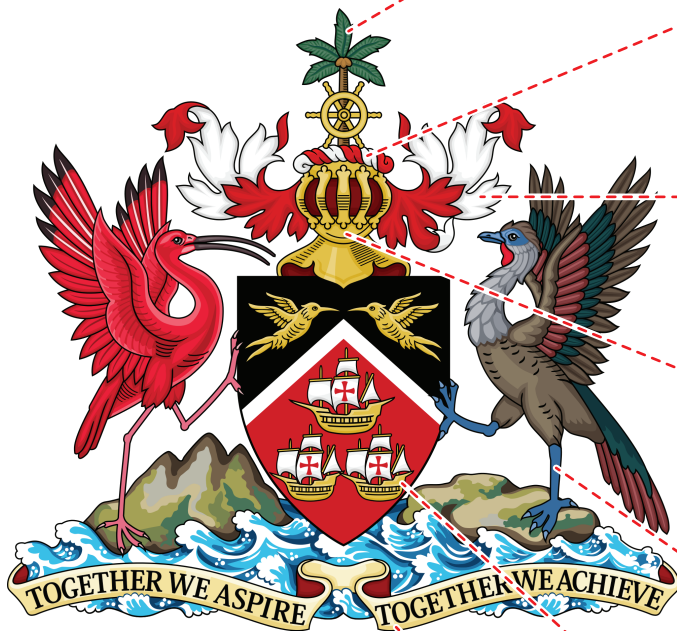


Elements of the Coat of Arms

of the Republic of Trinidad & Tobago

The Coat of Arms incorporates important historical and indigenous elements of Trinidad and Tobago.



The Crest

A fruitful or bearing conventional palm with five branches.

The Wreath

A rope with six parts using the two colours of the crest or mantle

The Mantle

Derived from the Queen's mantle. A red cape lined with white ermine (fur)

The Helm

A helmet from the Royal Coat of Arms adapted to five bars with a red interior

The Supporters

The Scarlet Ibis and the Cocrico in their natural colours

The Shield

Christopher Columbus' three ships together with two gold hummingbirds

The Motto

The National Motto written in Times New Roman font
